### **Evidence-Based Care Recommendations**

This guideline is based on the best available evidence, and is intended for use by primary care providers, such as pediatricians, family physicians, and other healthcare providers. Diagnosis and Evaluation of ADHD. The AAP guidelines for diagnosis and evaluation of ADHD recommend that primary care providers complete these steps:

### **ADHD Treatment Recommendations | CDC**

If community circumstances require limiting in-person visits, the guidance urges pediatricians to: Prioritize in-person newborn care, newborn well visits and immunization of infants and young children through 24 months of age whenever possible.

### **AAP issues guidance to ensure continued care for children ...**

Heart defects (~50% risk). Perform an echocardiogram, to be read by a pediatric cardiologist, regardless of whether a fetal echocardiogram was performed. Refer to a pediatric cardiologist for evaluation any infant whose postnatal echocardiogram results are abnormal. Feeding problems.

### **Pediatric Primary Care - Jones & Bartlett Learning**

**METHODS:** In 2013, we launched a multicomponent, transdiagnostic integrated BH model (Behavioral Health Integration Program [BHIP]) in a large pediatric primary care network in Massachusetts. Study participants comprised the first 13 practices to enroll in BHIP (Phase-1). Phase-1 practices are distributed across Greater Boston, with ~105 primary care practitioners serving ~114 000 patients.

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
