The Precision Bidding System

Precision Club is a bidding system in the game of contract bridge. It is a strong club system developed in 1969 for C. C. Wei by Alan Truscott, and used by Taiwan teams in 1969. Their success in placing second at the 1969 Bermuda Bowl launched the system's popularity. The central feature of the Precision system is that an opening bid of one club is used for any hand with 16 or more high card points, regardless of distribution. An opening bid of one of a major suit signifies a five-card suit and

Precision. Precision is a wonderful (and in my opinion, easier than "Standard") bidding system. All "strong" hands start with 1. A 1 opener shows approximately 16 or 17+ points. A 1NT opening bid is 14-16 balanced. All other 1-level openings (1, 1, 1) are natural and limited (11-15). The beauty of this system is two-fold:

1. The Concept of Precision. Bidding systems can be classified into two broad categories: natural systems and artificial systems. In natural systems, most bids (especially in the early phase of the bidding) denote length in the suit bid. In artificial systems, the bids are more highly codified, so that for example a bid of 1♣ may not be related to a holding in the club suit.

As I understand it, in the "precision" bidding system in bridge, you open one club with 16+ points (a greater than minimum opening hand), while all the other "one" level bids show 13-15 (a minimum). That includes 1NT, making it a "weak" 1 NT. I was taught that "higher bids mean higher points." Precision blatantly violates this rule.

The "standard" bids in strong club Precision Systems are very different from Standard American or the 2/1 Game Force System. Review of some common bids: The 1♣* bid (alert) shows a strong (16+ HCP hand), is artificial (can show any shape) and is forcing (for one round).

Everything from T-Precision bid is legal on the ACBL Basic+, Open and Open+ charts. The standard limited openings 1D, 1H, 1S, 2C, 2D can now be opened on some hands which meet the rule of 19. Third hand limited hands can be opened on near average strength; 8 hcp or meets the rule of 17.
